The children are allowed to wear a watch (not a smart watch) and if they have their ears pierced, one pair of small stud earrings. These must be removed or covered (please supply plasters) for PE. 3. We use our hands, feet and other objects in a kind way.

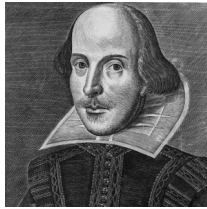

Curriculum Information Year Five Spring Term

English

This term our learning will be linked to the text, *Macbeth*. We will be working towards our own performance to share with friends, parents and carers.



Additionally, we will be securing our understanding of vocabulary, sentence structure, use of punctuation and spelling.

How you can help at home:

Please support this learning at home by reading daily with your child and asking them key questions about the text. For example, what do you think will happen next? Who is your favourite character? Why?

Maths

This term in Maths we will be developing our understanding and confidence when working with multiples, prime numbers and factors. We will also be learning about fractions, decimals and percentages. When focussing on shape (Geometry) we are going to learn about translation, rotation and reflection.



How you can help at home:

You can support this learning by practising the times tables regularly and allowing your child to access weekly tasks on Mathletics.

Science

This term in Science, we will be learning all about Earth and Space. We will be describing the movement of the Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun in the solar system. Our science lessons are always very exciting as we love to conduct experiments and be as practical as possible.



How you can help at home:

Why not help us by observing the different phases of the moon. You can even keep a moon diary for a month to explore it further.

History

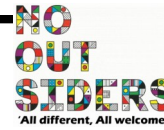
This term we are learning History linked with the Victorians. This will include how people lived, differences and similarities through time and key events in history that have impacted our lives today.

PSHCE

Within our PSHCE lessons this term we will be following the, 'No Outsiders programme which supports the promotion and education of diversity and equality.



How you can support at home:

Allowing your child to talk about their PSHCE topics at home can be a really good way for them to explore and contextualise some of the content.

Geography

This term, our Geography lessons will be linked with our History. We will be exploring the British Empire during the Victorian Era.



How you can help at home:

Why not help us by looking at the atlas with us and helping us find the different continents and oceans.

RE

This term we are going to be learning about Islam; What helps Muslims to live a good life, through learning about the 5 Pillars.

How you can help at home:

Ask your child what they have learnt about other cultures and traditions.



Computing: This term the children will learn about online safety and how they have a responsibility to keep themselves safe and also not cause unintended harm to others.
